School Uniform Policy

Introduction

It is our school policy that all pupils wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal hours.

Aims and Objectives

Our policy for school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- Is practical and smart
- Makes pupils feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents as good value for money
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

The Role of Parents

We ask parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that it is clean and in good repair. It is parents responsibility to ensure that all items of school uniform are clearly named.

The Grange School Uniform policy is set out below

Winter

- Dark grey or black school trousers
- White polo shirt
- School sweatshirt
- Black or grey socks
- Black polishable shoes
- Dark grey/black knee length skirt or pinafore dress
- Dark grey/black ankle length trousers
- White school polo shirt
- School sweatshirt
- Black, grey or navy tights
- White socks
- Black low heeled shoes

Summer

In addition to the above, the following may be worn during the summer months:

- Dark grey/black shorts (not sports shorts)
- Navy blue school cap
- Blue and white gingham or striped school dress

Physical Education (PE) to be worn on PE days.

- Plain black/dark blue shorts
- White school PE T-shirt or plain white T-shirt

During winter months children may wear:

- Plain black/dark blue joggers or leggings
- School jumper or plain navy blue jumper or hoody

Uniform Rules

Children may wear:

Sensible inexpensive wristwatches, but should be marked with the owner's name. The pupil must be responsible for their watch as the school is not responsible for damage or loss of personal property. Smart watches are not permitted; if a child wears a smart watch to school they will be asked to hand it in to the office.

Children should NOT wear:

Excessive jewellery should not be worn. Children may wear religious jewellery, although this should not introduce any risk to the safety of the child. If a child arrives at school in jewellery, it will be assumed that permission has been given (for the child to wear the items) by the parent. Any religious jewellery worn by the child is at the risk of the parent and the school accepts no responsibility for injuries that occur as a result of wearing this jewellery.

Children may wear small, stud earrings, These should not dangle from the ear in any way and should not be overly large. If a child arrives at school in earrings, it will be assumed that permission has been given (for the child to wear the items) by the parent. Any earrings worn by the child are at the risk of the parent and the school accepts no responsibility for injuries that occur as a result of wearing this jewellery. **Earrings should not be worn on PE days.**

1. Makeup, including nail varnish and false nails.
2. Trainers (except during PE/games lessons). The only exception to this is on medical grounds and a letter, containing full details, should be sent to the school please.
3. Sports branded clothing during the normal school day.
4. High heeled shoes on health and safety grounds.

5. Extreme hair cuts.
6. Tattoos of any description.

Branded waterproof jackets (optional) are also available.

Purchasing School Uniform

Sweatshirts, polo shirts, school caps, PE kit and bags can be purchased from either Little Rascals (previously known as ScallyWagz) in Daventry Town Centre or at Tailor Made on the Royal Oak Industrial Estate.
